Students will enroll in a minimum of 6 units, selecting one course besides General Studies 450: British Life and Culture** which is required of all students participating in the London Summer Program. Special Study Units are available for MA and MFA Graduate Students who want to study abroad as well.

ANTH 439: (3 units) Cultural Comparisons Through Film. [Dr. Nericcio] **(This course fulfills Upper Division Explorations Area B – Social and Behavioral Science as well as Cultural Diversity)**

ENG 493: (3 units) Literature and Film. [Dr. Nericcio]

C LT 470: (3 units) Folk Literature. [Dr. Nericcio]

GEN ST 450: (3 units) British Life and Cultures. **(This course fulfills Upper Division Explorations under Area C – Humanities) [Dr. Makey]**

**The British Life and Cultures course is taught by British guest lecturers and includes several trips. The lectures are planned to give students an understanding of British culture and civilization and emphasize a social, historical, and cultural approach to contemporary British society by examining British traditions and institutions.

Internships are offered for students interested in earning credit through an Internship (usually 3 units with departmental approval). The Internship program will be for an eight week period and the cost will be adjusted accordingly. As a global center for finance, design, applied research, higher education, public service, and the performing arts, London offers vast resources for interning students.

Join us for the London Summer Program along with your fellow SDSU students



Spend a summer semester living and studying in London, a truly international city, while you earn units toward your degree surrounded by art, culture, and history.

The London Summer Program for 2007 begins May 31 and ends July 12, a six week program.
(The Internship program begins May 24 and ends July 21, an eight week program.)

- Open to all SDSU sophomores, juniors, and seniors in good academic standing who have completed 30 or more units with a GPA or 2.5 or higher.
- SDSU Financial Aid programs are available to qualified students so apply early. All financial Aid matters are coordinated by Mr. Kevin Carter, College of Extended Studies, GC-2503.

Please note that participants in the London Summer Program must pay tuition through the College of Extended Studies!

Foundation for International Education provides housing, a transportation pass, insurance, classrooms at Foundation House and special membership in the Imperial College Student Union and provides 24 hour

access to a computer lab with 30 computers and free e-mail/ Internet services and wireless connections at Metrogate Center along with Student Services and an Academic and Internship Services staff located at Foundation House in Kensington.

Also included is Internship placement and supervision if applicable, co-curricular activities, and a subsidized extra-curricular program of events and activities.

Included in the cost of the program is a weekend trip to Paris



and a day trip to Stonehenge



APPLICATIONS

London Summer Program applications are available in the London Semester Office located in Arts and Letters 580 or at any of the Information meetings held during the Fall 2006 and Spring 2007 semesters.

The application and copy of the deposit check must be turned in no later than 2:00pm on Wednesday, March 14, 2007.

Applications must be accompanied by the following:

1. A copy of the initial deposit of \$500. The deposit includes a \$50. non-refundable application fee. All payments must be made to Foundation for International Education and are applied to the balance of total fees due. Financial Aid loans or grants apply.
2. Four passport photos for administrative purposes.

PASSPORTS

All participating students must have a valid passport for the duration of the program. Passport applications are available at all main post office branches. It may take 5 to 6 weeks to process your application, especially prior to summertime travel.

The following items are needed to obtain a passport for the first time:

1. Birth certificate with an official seal or other legal proof of birth documentation.
2. Two official passport photos (2"x 2").
3. A photo identification card such as a Driver's License, a CA state ID card, or a military ID card.
4. \$85.00 processing fee.
